



PARKING IN KETCHUM (YEAR-ROUND)

The city strives to provide safe, efficient, and convenient year-round parking. Due to high parking demand during events or popular tourism seasons, we ask everyone to consider public transportation, walking, cycling, or other non-motorized transportation to get around. PARKING IN SPACES DESIGNED FOR YOU

If you must drive and park, please see the back for parking locations and the below information on how to choose spaces designed for you.

CUSTOMERS: SHORT-TERM PARKING (2-HOURS OR LESS)

Customer parking was identified by the community as a priority over other uses. Our economy depends on it! Parking near businesses is marked with two-hour limit signs that apply to the street block. The time limit starts from when you initially park within the block. Only customers should use these spaces to ensure short walks to storefronts.

RESIDENTS AND EMPLOYEES: LONG-TERM PARKING (7-DAY MAXIMUM)

Long-term parking is available throughout town—on-street and in three public lots at Washington Ave. & 1st St., Leadville Ave. & 6th St., or 4th St. & Spruce Ave. Long-term spaces should be used for residential and employee parking, even if it is a block or two away. Using short-term spaces and moving your vehicle within the same block every two hours to avoid a ticket is not allowed and takes parking away from customers.

Short-term parking:

two hours or less

All-day parking

City parking lots

1st St. & Washington (all-day)
4th St. & Spruce Ave. (all-day)
Leadville & 6th St. (2-hour and all-day)

Miscellaneous parking

ADA, loading zones, city vehicle parking, etc.



PARKING RULES

PARKING IS **NOT** ALLOWED:



- Overnight during winter (November 1-May 1) in non-designated locations (see the city website for details)
- While the vehicle is idling
- In loading zones or outside parking lines
- Against the flow of traffic; in alleyways; or in front of a driveway, bus stop, or fire hydrant
