To The Mayor & City Council – Thank you for your pilot program improvements to winter parking options! I support all efforts to make overnight parking options easier while maintaining safety through efficient snow removal.

While residents will fairly quickly learn about the changes, I think it will be very important to clearly alert our visitors to the regulations. I think good signage will be key. While concise instructions might be somewhat complicated to formulate and post, there needs to be a way to easily access what they are. I would suggest some sort of winter badge that can be attached to virtually all posted parking regulation signs. As a starter, it might include a website link to where to find legal overnight parking, given how many can access this information right on their phones. Maybe too your graphic designer can create a very simple map that would fit on the badge pointing to target legal parking.
