

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1032

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1019 AND ADDING NEW LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY TIME LIMIT PARKING PROHIBITIONS; PROVIDING A SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, PROVIDING A CODIFICATION CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION BY SUMMARY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Ketchum to clarify time limit parking prohibitions in order to protect the public safety by creating a set of rules which, if faithfully adhered to by the public, will aid in providing safe, expeditious and orderly conduct upon the streets, alleys and all public rights-of-way in the city;

WHEREAS, the City has determined that in order to increase the availability of parking spaces for use of the general public it is necessary to reduce the number of vehicles abusing the time limits for parking; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO:

SECTION 1. Chapter 10.08060(A)(9) is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the stricken language and adding thereto the underlined language hereinbelow, to wit:

10.08.060 Parking prohibited in specific locations.

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device:

- A. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle:
 - 1. On, or drive a motorized vehicle upon, a sidewalk;
 - 2. Within an intersection;
 - 3. In a crosswalk;
 - 4. In, or drive a motorized vehicle upon, a bicycle facility;
 - 5. Alongside or opposite any public right-of-way excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
 - 6. On a roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a public right-of-way;
 - 7. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a public right-of-way;
 - 8. Within twenty (20) feet of an intersection;
 - 9. At any place where official traffic control devices prohibit or limit such stopping, standing or parking. It shall be prohibited for any vehicle to remain stopped, standing or parked past the time limit prescribed on each official traffic control device. In addition, at the expiration of the posted time limit the time limit cannot be accrued throughout the day and a vehicle can only park once per day per block, at which time it will be required that a vehicle be removed from the block in which it was parked, for the remainder of that calendar day;
 - 10. In an alley so as to hinder or block traffic;

11. Along any painted curb;

SECTION 2. SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that the provisions and parts of this Ordinance shall be severable. If any paragraph, part, section, subsection, sentence clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. CODIFICATION. The City Clerk is instructed pursuant to Section 1-1-3 of the City of Ketchum Municipal Code to immediately forward this ordinance to the codifier of the official municipal code for proper revision of the code.


SECTION 4. REPEALER CLAUSE. All City of Ketchum ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof which are in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. PUBLICATION. This Ordinance, or a summary thereof in compliance with Section 50-901A, Idaho Code, substantially in the form annexed hereto as Exhibit "A," shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication.

**PUBLICATION OF SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 1032
CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHUM, IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1019 AND ADDING NEW LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY TIME LIMIT PARKING PROHIBITIONS; PROVIDING A SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, PROVIDING A CODIFICATION CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION BY SUMMARY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

A summary of the principal provisions of Ordinance No. 1032 of the City of Ketchum, Blaine County, Idaho, adopted on December 17, 2007, is as follows:

Section 1: Amends Ordinance Number 1019 by adding new language to clarify that accrual of time limit parking throughout the day is prohibited and a vehicle can only park once per day per block, at which time the vehicle must be removed from the block for the remainder of the calendar day.

Section 2: Provides a savings and severability clause.

Section 3: Provides a codification clause.


Section 3: Provides a repealer clause.

Section 4: Provides for publication of a summary of the Ordinance.

Section 5: Establishes the effective date of December 26, 2007.


